

Generally speaking, the question and answer options from this questionnaire were read to the subjects. For some of the questions (e.g., Nos. 45 or 107 ff), subjects read the answer options themselves and then indicated their answers.

Questions 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 are filled out by the interviewer prior to the interview itself; questions 4, 6, 7, and 9-11 were completed following the interview.

Question Nos. 8 and 12 ff are the first ones that are posed directly to the subjects themselves.

When no entry is made in an answer box, this means that the question did not apply to the research subject and/or it was omitted.

When an "O" is entered, this indicates that the subject did not know the answer to the question. This entry is made only when necessary, and applies particularly to questions 72 ff, 143, 144, 198, and 199. Another parameter, which only applies to question Nos. 27, 39, and 42, is noted there in cursive.

When "99" is entered, this means that, as of the time of the interview, the subject has not yet experienced or participated in the behavior described (example: question 51).

Furthermore, one must see to it that questions 89 and 227 are not overlooked.

If no experiences are reported for questions 109-107, the interview skips to question 227. The interview is then terminated.
